Line Spacing

The examples given here have been single-spaced to save room. APA requires double-spacing.

Citing linked articles

Most of the library's databases can access articles in other databases by clicking on a hyperlink such as "Linked Full Text" or "Full Text Linking". If you retrieve a "Linked" article, you must cite the database containing the article, not the one you used to find it.
