Transfer Guide

Q & A about transferring to Anderson University

Q: I have completed several courses at another college and I'm ready to transfer to Anderson. What are the general transfer requirements?

A: Students who transfer must be in "good standing" at the last school they attended and have a cumulative college GPA of at least 2.0. Generally this means that they are not on academic or disciplinary probation or suspension. We do not require that you must complete a minimum number of hours before transferring to Anderson. However, if you are entering the traditional program and have completed fewer than 24 semester hours (or 36 quarter hours), we will need official high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores. All students who have been out of high school more than 5 years may take a Writing Assessment in place of submitting SAT/ACT test scores.

Q: How can I find out exactly which courses I have taken at other colleges will count toward my Anderson degree?

A: After you've applied to Anderson, ask your college Registrar to send an official transcript of your work directly to Anderson's Admissions Office. Once you're accepted, we'll forward your transcripts to our Registrar for evaluation. You will be given credit for coursework that is similar in content and hours of credit to that offered by Anderson. However, regardless of the number of hours you transfer in to Anderson, you will still have to complete the requirements of your degree here at Anderson.

Q: Will my college GPA transfer in along with my credits?

A: No. Grades do not transfer - only hours of credit. Your GPA at Anderson will be earned in Anderson courses only.

Q: I have completed two or more years of college courses. How much longer will it take to earn a bachelor's degree at Anderson?

A: It depends on how many of the courses you have taken will apply to the requirements for the degree you intend to pursue at Anderson. Anderson's traditional bachelor degree programs require a minimum of 128 semester hours of credit, and the ACCEL degree programs require a minimum of 120 hours of credit. The highest number of hours required in a major is 140 hours. You must complete 36 semester hours at Anderson, including at least 15 semester hours of upper-division credit in your major. Thirty (30) of the last 36 hours required for the bachelor's degree must be the last hours Q: completed in the program.

Does Anderson have direct transfer agreements with any schools? What do these agreements mean?

A: Anderson has developed transfer agreements with several two-year colleges in South Carolina. These agreements mean that Anderson will accept a minimum of 60 hours of credit in transfer from these schools without further review of the student's record if the student has completed an associate's degree. The actual number of credits that will transfer depends on the degree that the student has earned at the previous institution and the degree pursued at Anderson.

Q: Will all the courses I've taken count toward my degree at Anderson?

A: If the courses are part of a bachelor's degree, an associate's degree, or a college-transfer program, most will probably count toward your degree at Anderson. In general, Anderson practices a policy of liberal transfer of credit from regionally-accredited colleges and universities. However, only 64 semester hours may be applied to a bachelor's degree at Anderson if those credits are transferred from an institution only awarding associate's degrees.

Q: Will a course in which my final grade was a "D" transfer to Anderson?

A: No. Only courses in which you earn a grade of "C" or higher will transfer to Anderson. Additionally, no remedial coursework will be accepted for credit regardless of the grades earned in those classes.

Q: Are there application deadlines for entering Anderson's traditional daytime program?

A: Yes. Anderson offers rolling admission (meaning that you will find out your status shortly after your file is complete) but there are deadlines for submitting an application and being accepted. For the Fall semester, transfer students must apply in time to be accepted to Anderson before August 1. For the Spring semester, students must be accepted and submit a deposit before December 15. These deadlines ensure that everything you need as a new student can be completed before you enroll at Anderson.

Transfer Requirements

- Students should have earned a cumulative college GPA of 2.0 or higher to be considered for admission to Anderson.
- Transfer students must be in "good standing" at their previous college and must not be on academic or disciplinary probation or suspension.
- Previous coursework can be transferred to Anderson only if a grade of "C" or higher was earned in the courses.
- If students have earned fewer than 24 college credits they will be required to submit high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores (if entering the traditional program and out of high school fewer than 5 years) or a Writing Assessment (if out of high school 5 years or more).
- Additional courses will be evaluated as requested.
